In the name of God I Adam Ryland of the County of Franklin and State of Virginia being old & infirm thought of sound memory looking to mine the certainty of death and the uncertainty of like to make this my last Will and Testament in the first place I do commit my soul to God who gave it me, and my body to the dirt from whence it came desiring my body to be buried in a christian like manner & as to my worldly goods which God has ble^d me with after paying all my just debts and burial expenses I do leave with my wife for her benefit during her natural life the whole of my Estate both real and personal and after her death the remaining part to be sold for the best price it will bring and equally divided between all my children except my Daughter Barbara Ryland late Barbara Arthur (Wife) to my son Peter Ryland, Lewis Ryland, Jacob Ryland, Mary Ryland late Mary Hepler, Elizabeth Ryland late Elizabeth Porman Katherin Ryland late Katherin Stevenson, Ess Ryland late Ess Stevenson Peggy Ryland late Peggy Webster, Abolmar Ryland late Abolmar Dellow. Thirdly I do give to my daughter Barbara Ryland late Barbara Arthur one dollar as her part for reasons best known to myself Also I do appoint Peter Stevenson my good friend my Executor to act and transact all my business the Witness hereof I set my hand and affix my seal the 15th June 1819
