 Being weak of Body but of sound Memory and Considering the uncertainty of Life  
 last Will do make this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all former Wills by me  
 and Testament made heretofore first I recommend my soul into the hands of a Merciful God  
 and my Body to be decently Buried and in order to dispose of my Estate having  
 Satisfaction I do it in the manner and form as followeth Viz.  
 Item I bind unto my Beloved Wife Frances Estis the use of the Plantation  
 Innowline upon with all the Stock of horses Cattle Hogs Sheep &c. also all  
 my household furniture Bed Goods &c. with all my Kitchen furniture  
 all my Crop of Corn Tobacco Wheat Oats &c. on said Plantation when I shall  
 decease, she out of the sum Paying all my just debts together with the sum  
 of my two Negroes viz Darsey & Grace all to be left her During her Natural  
 Life only what she may accept Viz My Desire is that my wife Give  
 out my stock &c above mentioned unto my Daughter Fanny Estis Two  
 Liberty Boxes and Purchase her a Woman Saddle worth four Pounds Ten  
 Shillings also one feather Bed and furniture I also Give unto my Daughter  
 Fanny Estis my Negro Girl Named Lucy John and the lawful heirs of

her Body for ever, also I give unto my Daughter Mary Fuller one Lotely Court half  
 out of the Stock Land my Wife as above Item my Will and Desire is after the Death  
 of my Beloved wife that my Two Negroes <sup>my</sup> Dame & Grace and her increase with all  
 my household furniture Beds Goods Crops &c that then shall or may remain be Equally  
 Divided Amongst my Dear Children hereafter mentioned viz Due Barts Koziah  
 Haby Elizabeth Anglin Fanny Estis Elisha Estis Bottom Estis Asa Estis and  
 Jepo Estis & their heirs, only it is to be Observed that my Sons Elisha & Bottom  
 Estis are to render an Account in Kind of what Stock and furniture they have  
 Received from me heretofore that all my Sons may be Equal, Item I give unto my  
 Sons Asa Estis and Jepo Estis all the Land I now Live upon Containing Three hundred  
 acres to be Equally Divided after my Wifes Decease to them and the Heirs of  
 their Body for ever, Lastly I constitute and Appoint my Loving wife Francis Estis  
 my Dear Son Bottom Estis and my well Beloved friends Frederick Rivers and  
 Samuel Calland the Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, Given under  
 my hand and seal this first Day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand  
 Seven hundred and Ninety <sup>c</sup>
