In the name of God, amen, I Thomas Campbell of Franklin County of sound mind and disposing memory, but weak in body, calling to mind that it is ordained for all men once to die, do make this my last Will and Testament first I desire to be decently buried in Christian like form, hoping for happiness in another world, thought the merits of our Lord and saviour Jesus Christ, Then I lend to my beloved wife Charity, my lands, Negroes horses stocks of all kind household and kitchen furniture and plantations utensels during widowhood, and the minority of my beloved daughter Patsy but out of the profits of the Estate thus lent my beloved Charity during widowhood and the minority of my daughter, my said wife is to educate, board, and clothe my said daughter but on my wifes marrying again, or my daughters marrying or coming of age, then and in either of these events I will and desire that my Executors herein after named lot off to my said wife to be held by her for her life and no longer one third part of my lands, and one third part of my Slaves and one third part of my household and kitchen furniture and one third part of my of all my stocks of horses cattle &c, to be held as above during her life only then I give and bequeath unto my daughter Patsy in her marriage coming of age, all my estate real and personal of every kind and description, whatsoever, except that lent my wife her mother by the foregoing then, and that lent her mother is on the death of her mother, to go, to and become the property of my said daughter Patsy to be held by her my said Daughter and heirs of her body. Then It my Will and desire that if my daughter Patsy die before she comes of age, marries or has heirs of her body that then, and in that event my whole estate real and personal which by this will is given to my said daughter be divided into three parts one part thereof to go to my Brother William Campbell and his heirs for ever one other part to go to my Brother Robert Campbell and his heirs for ever, and the remaining part to go to my sister Sally Ashinghurst if her heirs for ever and should either of my Brothers William and Robert, or my dear sister Sally be dead, then the part is to be held by their heirs hereby devised to each of them, on the event of the death of my daughter without heirs of her body or having come of age, then my will and desire further is that all monies due me by bonds or otherwise and all owing by me at the time of my death to be applied to and paid to my said daughter Patsy
