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In the name of God Amen, I Peter Angle Sr. being weak of body but of strong mind and disposing Memory, and calling to mind that all men must die, do make and Ordain this my last and Testament in Manner and form following, first after my decease its my desire that all my just debts be speedily paid if any. Then I give to my beloved Wife Elizabeth all my lands and Tenements that I may die possessed of as also one milk Cow any one she may chose out of my stock also one feather Bed and furniture, also the Move that I row use during her natural life, as also as much Cash of the Crop now on hand as will be sufficient for her support for one year. its is further my desire that all bonds and Accounts that I may die possessed of, that my Executors shall collect, and that with any money that may be on hand shall remain in the hands of Executors to be given to my wife Elizabeth as she shall stand in need thereof. Then after my Decease all my property not here in before mentioned, shall be sold by my Executors and the money arising from such sale is also to remain in their hands to be given to my wife as she may stand in need thereof provided however that if my wife should hereafter Marry then my Estate to be divided as here in after named. ~~Then after the decease of my wife its my desire that all my lands be~~ sold together with the articles bequeathed to my Wife during her life be also sold and the monies arising from such sale together with any monies that may remain in the hands my Executors to be equally divided between my seven children Robert John, Jacob, Henry, Peter, Daniel and Tamer. Angle and Fanny Selman Wife of John Selman. Lastly I constitute and appoint my son John Angle and my friend John Dawson Executors to this my last Will and Testament, revoking all others. In Witness of all which have hereunto set my hand and seal this 5 day of February 1824
