In the name of God amen, whereas it is ordained for all men once
die, and calling to mind how uncertain the time is, when that may
happen I George Turnbull being in my sound senses and of disposing
mind, though weak of body do make and ordain this to be my last
Will and Testament revoking all wills heretofore made by me
first I desire my body to be decently buried - hoping for a resurrection
through the merits of our blessed saviour Jesus Christ. Item I desire
that all my just debts be paid, and as to such property as God has
been pleased to bestow on me, I dispose of it as follows. Item I leave to
my beloved Wife during her natural life, all my Negroes, Stocks
of horses, cattle, sheep, hogs, household furniture and personal property
of all kinds, and descriptions and at the death of my beloved Wife
Abigail Turnbull, my will and desire is that the Negroes and other
property hereby left her, go to and be divided equally among my
five daughters, and provided any of my Daughters should die before
their mother, then the children of such Daughter to come in for
a fifth part - my will further is that my beloved Wife have the
use and enjoyment of all my Lands, during life - and at the
death of my beloved Wife, I give to my son Lewis Turnbull, and his
heirs for ever, all my Lands, to hold the same in fee simple, but
upon consideration of my doing so much for my son Lewis
Turnbull - said Lewis Turnbull is in three years from my death to
pay his brother William Turnbull the sum of one Thousand Dollars
money of these United States, and in event of the death of the P. William
Turnbull then D. Lewis Turnbull is to pay the aforesaid sum of one
Thousand dollars to the children of his brother William Turnbull -
For fear that my Will with respect to the division of my personal
property after my death might be misunderstood I do hereby direct
that when ^{the} personal property is divided after the death of my beloved
Wife that ^{the} Negroes be divided equally as aforesaid among my
Daughters, and that in ^{the} division, those Negroes shall be included
which may at any time have left or given to any of my said
Daughters - Lastly I appoint my beloved Wife Abigail Turnbull

Executive and John Sample Lewis Turnbull Joseph Hale and
Edmund Hale Executors of this my last Will & Testament - In
Witness of all which I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my
seal this 4th day of December 1807 my name written in my own hand
writing.

This Last Will and Testament of George Turnbull deceased
was proved by the oaths of Nathaniel H. Claiborne & Portland
Cabanif two of the Executors herein, and ordered to be recorded.

and at a Court held for said County January 14th 1808 on the
motion of Lewis Turnbull one of the Executors named in the said
Will, who made Oath as the Law directs and together with
Skettaw Taylor & Graham Taylor his securities, entered into and
acknowledged his Bond in the Penalty of Ten Thousand Dollars
conditioned as the Law directs certificate is granted him for
obtaining a probat in due form, liberty being reserved to the
other Executors to join in the Probat when they shall think fit.

And at a Court held for said County February 1st 1808

on the motion of Joseph Hale another of the Executors in the said
Will named who took the Oath of an Executor, and, together with
Robert Irwin and Josiah Woods, his securities, entered into and
acknowledged his Bond in the Penalty of Ten Thousand Dollars
conditioned as the Law directs, a certificate is granted him to be
joined in the Probat of the said Will.
