In the name of God amen. I Happy Tally of the County of Franklin &
 State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory
 for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human
 life and being desirous to dispose of all such Worldly Estate as it
 hath pleased God to bless me with, do make this my Last will and
 Testament. In the first place I ordain after my decease that all
 my Last Debts and funeral expences shall be punctually & honestly
 paid out of property. Secondly I will and bequeath to my son Pleasant
 Tally my Negro Slave King one bed & furniture one near bed
 and saddle. Also one hundred acres of Land it being the Land and
 plantation that I now live on. Also I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Nancy Richardson Tally my Negro Slave Caty one
 Bed and furniture, one bow and arrow, to live their heirs forever. Also
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Richardson one Dollar
 and no more of my Estate. Also I give to my Daughter Pally Green
 one Dollar & no more of my Estate. Also I give and bequeath to
 my Daughter Susanah Tally one Dollar and no more of my
 Estate. Also I desire that all my household & Kitchen not
 bequeath, and my Stock of Hogs shall be sold after my decease
 and the money arising therefrom with all my Debts after collected
 shall be equally divided between my son Pleasant Tally and
 my Daughter Nancy Richardson Tally, and every other property
 both Real or personal that I shall die possessor of shall be equally
 divided between the said Pleasant & Nancy Tally by my Executor
 I also appoint and ordain Lewis Davis Executor of this my
 Last Will and Testament. Given under my hand and

 Margaret and Eve to have four shillings each and no more I
 leave and desire Jacob Beckner to act and be my Executor of my Estate
