County of Franklin in the State of Virginia at this time
of sound mind and memory, though advanced in years,
and reflecting on the shortness and uncertainty of human
life, do make and ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament. In the first place I resign my body to the earth,
and recommend my soul to the Almighty who gave it, to
me with a firm hope and believe that it will be again
raised at the last day and saved through the mercy of God,
and through the merits and sufferings of Jesus Christ the
mediator between God & man. and as touching such worldly
goods and property, as it hath been my good fortune to be
blessed with in this life, I give and bequeath the same in
the following manner.

I give and bequeath to John Powell of County of Franklin
in Virginia, the tract of Land on which I now reside, with
every species of personal property whatever, horses, cattle, hogs,
sheep, and all household and Kitchen Furniture and
plantation utensils &c.
