is to have her support on the Plantation I now live on During
her natural life; and unto my beloved sons John & Henry I
give the Plantation wherein I now live to be equally Divided
between them and my other property that I am possessed of I
allow to be sold and equally divided Between Martin John &
Randolph & Henry after they pay my son Wyatt forty pounds.

and I do hereby confirm this to be my last Will and Testament Given under my hand and affixed my seal this 11th Day of November 1807.
