of sound mind, thanks be to almighty god for the same, but calling to mind the uncertainty of
this fallowing World and that all flesh must yield when it pleaseth god to take so I therefore
make and constitute this my last will and Testament and desire it may be received by all
as such Test I design my last to make from whence it came and my body to the earth
to be Buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as to my worldly
Estate I dispose of it as followeth (to wit) first my Will and Desire is that all my Just debts
be paid, Item, I do give and bequeath to my son, Thompson Burdett my tract of Lands
whereon I now live with all my Household goods, and Furniture of all kinds with all my Stock
of Horses, hogs and cattle, sheep, together with all my plantation tools of all kind with
lock and every other thing that I possess, to him and his heirs for ever in Witness
whereof I have unto do set my hand and seal this Eight day of March, one thousand
seven Hundred and Eighty four
