Inquisition Indented and Taken at the House of Peter Kingery in the County aforesaid the 21th Day of September in the 1st Year of the Common Wealthe in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred & of Jacob Kingery Eighty Nine Before me Swinfield Hill Cononer for the County aforesaid upon the View of the Body of Jacob Kingery Late of the County aforesaid then & there Lying Dead and upon the Oaths of Thomas Crumby, Owen Pull John Truston, William Crump Bartlett, Wade Israh Willis Charles Myring Thomas Huston Tho^r. Miller, Joseph Stutter Jacob Brillimon Joseph Lewis Peter Lechart William Griffith Conard Harkriden Danice Sprangler

and John Kelly Good and Lawful Men of the County aforesaid who being sworn and charged to Enquire on the part of our said Common Wealth when where how and after what Manner the said Jacob Kingery came to his Death do say upon their Oaths That one certain Day hence of the Value of Ten Shillings the Property of Peter Kingery on the Sixth Day of September in the Year of our said one Thousand seven hundred and Eighty Nine did by Violently Running out of the way which appears was intended by the said Jacob Kingery and did him the said Jacob Kingery throw against an old Black Oak Stump about Eight feet high and about one foot Through by which fall he the said Jacob Kingery in and upon the Left side of his Temple Eye head & Shoulder and Breast did receive one Mortal wound by breaking his Skull and Bruising his Shoulder of which Mortal wounds the aforesaid Jacob Kingery being Removed about the Space of Two hundred Yards to the house of Peter Kingery died in the Space of four hours from the time he received the said wounds. In Witness whereof as well the aforesaid Coroner as the Jurors aforesaid have to this Inquisition put their Seals on the Day and Year aforesaid and the Place aforesaid
