In the name of god amen I Jacob Pileman sen^r of the County of Franklin
 and State of Virginia being sick and weak of Body but of sound Mind & of
 Memory thanks be to god for his mercies calling unto mind the mortality
 of my body & that I am appointed for all men once to die do make and
 Ordain this my last will and testament that is to say Principally
 & first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty god,
 that gave it, and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion
 of my Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again
 by the mighty power of god. And as touching such worldly goods
 as it hath pleased god to bless me I give and devise and dispose
 of the same in the following manner and form Viz
 First I desire that my Just debts & funeral Expenses be first paid out of
 my Estate & secondly I give unto my Wife Hallburgilly Pileman after
 the payment of my debts aforesaid all and singular my personal
 Estate household goods & furniture during her natural life, and to my
 son Jacob Pileman Jun^r I give devise and bequeath all that part of
 the old tract of Land on Daniels run of black water Surveyed for
 Daniel Donahoo march 19th 1747 which lieth above a new dividing line
 running from two Chestnut oaks on a road s^o 35 that King said run to
 a double Chestnut tree on the s^o side of s^o run also part of a tract of one
 hundred and sixty acres on the Branches of s^o run running by a new line
 from the Chestnut tree afores^d s^o 28 N 42 p^o to a Spanish oak s^o 11 N 57
 p^o to a white oak in the old line & with it N 16 N 56 p^o to a horse wood
 s^o 23 E 102 p^o to a poplar on Daniels run in s^o Donahoo's line and
 with it to the dividing line afores^d also part of 204 Acres adjoining s^o
 Donahoo's s^o line's Beginning at Donahoo's Corner Beech on s^o run thence
 S 16^o West 64 p^o to a white oak thence New Line through the tract
 s^o 64 E 28 to a W O s^o 89 E 50 to a beech N 16 E to a poplar in the old
 line and with it to the beginning also part of a tract of Land of 1670^o
 on the Waters of Black water and Pigeon river running by a dividing line
 along the dividing ridge between s^o Rivers lying to my s^o son Jacob
 Pileman Jun^r all that part of said tract which lieth on the Waters of
 Pigeon river to have and to hold unto my son Jacob & his heirs forever

on his paying thirty pounds good trade Equal to money two years after my
 Decease to my daughter Anne Bowder also to my son John Phillaman I give
 devise and bequeath all that part of Daniel Donahoes Survey and a
 Survey of 160 Acre which lieth on Daniels run below my son Jacob
 Phillaman line of acres and also 50 acres adjoining 1^o donahoes dunes
 which I hold by deed from Joseph Hale to have and to hold the s^d
 Lands to my s^o John Phillaman and to his heirs and assigns for
 ever on his paying thirty pounds good trade equal to money to my
 Daughter Barbara Martin two years after my decease and also to furnish my
 1^o Wife with a good warm dwelling house also plenty of good fuel
 Diet cloathing washing and firewood and all other necessary attendance
 During her natural life also to my son Daniel Phillaman I give &
 Desire and bequeath all that part of a tract of ~~land~~ Acre of Land
 on the Waters of Daniels run & Pigg river which lieth above my son
 Jacob Phillamans line on the branch where Sherwood Bybe now
 lives to have and to hold the said lands to him and his heirs & assigns
 forever also to my daughter Barbara Martin I give devise & bequeath
 all my right title claim & Interest in & to a certain tract of land in
 Montgomery County on the Branches of Little river joining Nathan Sellers
 line I also give devise and bequeath to my daughter Anne Bowder & the
 Heirs of her Body all the lands I hold up s^o Daniels run above Jacobs line
 which I have not before bequeathed to be enjoyed by her and her heirs
 assigns forever and at the decease of my wife I desire that all my personal
 Estate may be Equally divided between my s^o son Daniel Phillamans Barne-
 ba Martin and Anne Bowder and their Heirs and I also appoint my
 two sons Jacob & Daniel Phillaman Executors of this my last Will & Testament
 Ratifying this and no other to be my last Will and Testament and
 utterly disallowing Revoking & Disannulling all other Wills ^{legacies} requests and
 Executions by me in any wise before named In Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and affixed my seal this 19th day of July 1796 the thousan seven
 hundred and ninety six Published Pronounced & Declared by the said
 Jacob Phillaman to be his last Will & Testament in presence of us.
