In the name of God I Jacob Shooman of Franklin County being very sick & Weak in body but of a sound mind and Memory and calling to mind the Mortality of the Body that it is appointed for man to die do make & Ordain this my last Will and Testament for the purpose of disposing my Worldly Goods in the following manner Viz: first I Recommend my soul to the Care of God & my Body to be Buried by Executors at there discretion I Direct that my funeral Expence and Lawfull debt be paid I Give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Mary Shooman all my Real and personal Estate During her Widow hood till my Youngest Daughter Lussana Shooman comes of age but if she my said wife Mary Before my Youngest daughter should come to age as aforesaid I Direct that my Executors shall Divide my Estate in the following manner of it it remain in the Hands of my said wife as in their Discretions they shall Judge Best for the Interest of my Children to wit first I Direct that my said Wife shall Have one third of my Estate as the Law Directs the part which is still remaining to be Equally Divided amongst the whole of my Children and if a part shall be necessary to Effect such Division I Direct that my Executors make such sale and also that they Pay out my Children

if my said Wife should ~~mean~~ as in their Judgment they shall think
 best and lastly I appoint constitute and Ordain my Friends Daniel Bea-
 heart & John Bowman my Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 and do by these Presents Revoke all other Wills and Testaments In
 Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this
 Seventh day of August one thousand seven hundred and ninety two
