In the name of God Amen, I James Martin son of Franklin County, Virginia, do make this my last Will and Testament as follows to wit: first I desire my just debts which are few in number & trifling in amount to be paid, as also my funeral expences. Item I leave to my beloved Wife Mary Martin, during life, all my Estate, of every sort both real and personal, except and Negro Man named Isaac who is to be sold by my Executors, and with the money arising from such sale, a Negro Girl is to be bought, for the benefit of my Wife during her life, and if the money arising from the sale of Isaac be insufficient for the purchase of a Negro Girl, my Executors will and may sell, such stock of cattle horses or sheep, as will be sufficient. Item on the death of my beloved Wife, my Will and desire is that my Executors or the survivor or survivors of them take possession of all my lands and hold them for the benefit of my Daughter Rebecca Martin, and they are hereby authorized and required to apply the Rents and annual profits of said lands to the maintenance and support of said Rebecca Martin during her life. On the death of my beloved Wife, such of my personal property as remains, is to be divided among my sons John Martin, James Martin, Robert Martin and Hugh Martin, and my daughters, Eleanor Watson and Jane Pick, share and share alike, to be enjoyed by them & their heirs forever, and after the death of my said Daughter Rebecca, and my wife Mary, I give all my lands to be divided among my said sons, John, James, Robert and Hugh Martin and my daughters Eleanor Watson and Jane Pick, share and share alike, to them and their heirs forever, and should either of my said sons, John, James, Robert and Hugh, or my Daughter Eleanor and Jane, be dead, then what is devised them by this Will, to go to and vest in their legal

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representatives, I give To my Daughter Agnes Standley, Peggy McHenry
and Ann Ramsey and to the Heirs of my son William Martin and
I give each one Dollar, and no more. Lastly I constitute and appoint
my Wife Mary Martin Executrix, my son John Martin and my friends
Thomas Craig and Nathl McLaiborne Executors to this my last Will
and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me heretofore

ing to Law, Certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate in
