Inquisition Indented taken at Peter Gearharts in the County aforesaid this Ninth Day of January one Thousand seven hundred and Eighty Nine Before me Swinsford Hill coroner for the Common Wealth for the County aforesaid upon due Examination of the Cause of the Death of John Gearhart Infant and upon the Oaths of James Gama Peter Gearhart John Henry Gearhart and Abraham Gearhart, Good and Lawful Men of the County aforesaid and Witnesses and upon the Oaths of Moses Green Randolph Hall John Adam Isaiah Willis Charles Walden Bartlett Wade Charles Minnie Thomas Hale William & Mary John Faxon Thomas Jones Jun^r & Owen Peuble Good and Lawful Men of the County aforesaid who being sworn and charged to enquire on the Part of the Common Wealth when, where, how ^{often} ~~and~~ what manner the said John Gearhart came to his Death do say upon their Oaths that on the 30 day of December Last at the house of Peter Gearharts in the County aforesaid that by accident happening in the hands of the said John Gearhart he was killed suddenly by the firing off a Smooth Gun which gave him a mortal wound in the right Temple which Gun is to the value of Ten Shillings
