In the name of God Amen, I James McVey of the County of Franklin and State of Virginia being very sick, and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be given to God, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men, once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my Executors, and as touching such worldly estate, wherewith is hath pleased God to bless me in this life, I give, devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

First after my just Ditts being paid, I Will and bequeath unto my loving Wife Mary McVey, her Executors, Heirs and assigns also one third part of my Estate

~~and in my personal, the balance of my Estate to be equally~~
divided among my children after deducting from those such legal sums which they have received in advance as stands charged on my Book, to wit, after deducting from my son James McVey one hundred Dollars which he has received in advance, also twenty Dollars from Polly Miller which she has received in advance; also Margaret Gifford fifty pounds, that she has received in advance, also Elizabeth Elliott fifty pounds that she has received in advance, also Thomas McVey twenty Dollars that he has received in advance, also George McVey

Fifty pounds which he has received in advance, and after deducting from each of them the sums charged to them, my Will and desire is that my children, all to share equally in that part of my Estate given them, namely James McVey, Polly Miley, Margaret Grigg, Elizabeth Collicott, Sarah Gibson, Thomas C. McVey, George McVey, John McVey, these my eight children to share equally in my Estate after deducting as aforesaid is my true and last Will and Testament; I also constitute and appoint my son George McVey and Thomas C. McVey, my Executors to this my last Will and Testament, And I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former Testament, Wills, Legacies, Bequests, and Executors by me in anywise before mentioned, Willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal nineteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty, Signed, Sealed, Published, pronounced and declared by the said James McVey as his last Will and Testament in the presence of us, who in his presence, and the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names

My Executors from my will are fully authorized to sell my Lands and the money to be equally divided as aforesaid.
