Item first of all it is my Will and desire that all my Just debts shall be paid and the Residue of my property to be divided in the following manner. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Sarah Stone one hundred and fifty acres of Land whereon my Grap Mill now stands together with one half of the nett profits of said Mill during her natural life or Widowhood. and at her decease or marriage the said Land and Mill to go to my son Cliffford Stone for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Wife Sarah Stone one Negroe Woman Cady during her natural life or widowhood and at her decease or marriage to be Equally divided between my two sons Cliffford and Reuben Stone for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Sarah Stone one Riding

house saddle and Bridle for ever. and at her disposal to do as she
 pleases also Two cows & calfs. four head of Sheep such as she may
 chuse also all my stock of hogs. to gether with all the house
 hold furniture and working Tools for ever. to be disposed off as she
 may see cause, Item. I give and bequeath to my son blifford
 Stone one half the nett proffits of my Grist Mill. and at the
 Death or marriage of my Wife Sarah Stone the whole to be
 Returned to him, Item I give and bequeath unto my son Patrick
 Stone five dollars & no more, Item I give and bequeath to my son
 William Stone five dollars & no more, Item I give and bequeath
 unto my ^{son} Thomas Stone five Dollars & no more, Item. I appoint
 constitute and ordain. My son blifford Stone my Executor and
 my wife Sarah Stone my Executrix, Item it is my Will and
 Desire that my sons blifford Stone & Reuben Stone do pay all my
 Just Debt. and the Balance of my Estate that is not willed away
 to be equally divided between my two sons blifford Stone & Reuben
