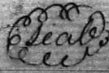

body but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the
Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men to Die do make and ordain this my last Will and
Testament and first it is my Desire that all my Just Debts
shoud be paid. and then the ballance of all my Estate I give
To my beloved Wife Mary Watson (to wit) one Negro Woman
Lucy one Negro Boy Squire one Negro Girl Milley one Negro
Woman Hannah and Negro Girl Judy also one Wagon and
Gear one Dark Bay Mare and both one Sorrell mare and both
with all my plantation tools and Utensils and all my Stock
of cattle Hogs and sheep, also five feather Beds Bedsteads and all
the furniture therunto belonging also one Black Walnut Chubbard
and three Black Walnut Tables with all my house and Kitchen
Furniture to her for ever, and I do constitute and appoint my
beloved Wife Mary Watson and Peter Low to Execute this my last
Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly revoke an Disannull
all other Wills and Testaments made by me at any time before
this, Rattifying this and no other to be my Last Will and
Testament in Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and
seal 20 day of May 1808.

I William Wright of Franklin County am well in health and of perfect senses and nowing thanks be to God for his mercies and caling to mind the mortality of man and that all men once must die I do make constitute ordain and appoint this my last will and Testament in manner and form followeth - Here I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Enoch Wright all my Land and plantation where I now live and all my stock and furniture to him and his heirs for ever and the S. Enoch shall find the S. William with all things that is needs full during his life I likewise appoint my two sons James Wright and George Wright and Enoch Wright my whole and sole Executors and trustees of this my Last Will and Testament Witness my hand and seal the day and Year above written

At a court held for Franklin County January 2^d 1809

This Last Will and Testament of William Wright deceased was proved by the oath of Isaac Abshire, Philemon Smith & Abraham Abshire the Witnesses hereto, and ordered to be recorded. And at a court held for Franklin County September 3^d 1810, on the motion of George Wright one of the Executors herein named, who took the oath prescribed by Law and together with James Wray his security entered into and acknowledged his Bond in the penalty of fifty Dollars conditioned according to Law, certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate in due form of Law.
