Holland In the name of God, Amen, I Thomas Holland of Franklin County weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory and Calling to mind that it is appointed for all men once to Die do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament and as touching my worldly Estate (whereunto it pleased God to bless me in this life, I bequeath and dispose of the same in manner and form following) (That is to say) in the first place, it is my desire that all my just debts should be paid and then I desire my beloved wife Sally Holland should have a plentiful and comfortable support out of my Estate during her natural life or widowhood and also a Sufficiency to raise and Educate my Children that is yet under age at the discretion of my Executors, hereafter named and all if she should marry again to receive a child's part and at her decease to return to my Children again by giving Bond with approv^d Security I all give to my son Billy M. Holland or Negro boy Dick to him and his heirs forever, I also desire (Till my Executors
