I John Ashworth of the County of John Franklin and State of Virginia, Being sick and weak in Body Will &c but of sound mind and disposing memory, for which I thank Everlasting God, calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I Give and bequeath the same in manner following that is to say.

Item 1st I desire that All my Tobacco be Sold as soon as it can be made ready and removed to Market and out of the moneys arising from the sale thereof, all my just debts and funeral Expences be paid, should my Tobacco prove insufficient for that purpose then I desire, that my Executors hereinafter named may sell so much of the same

of my personal Estate as shall be sufficient to pay all such debts and Expenses as aforesaid that remain unpaid.

Item 3rd I give unto my son Stephen one mare and saddle one cow one sow and piggs one Sheep and one feather bed, amounting in the whole to one hundred and four Dollars all of which he has heretofore received. Item 4th I desire that each and every one of the residue of my Children shall have to the amount of one hundred and four dollars out of my Estate so soon as they shall respectively arrive at Lawful age and call for the same that is to say Elizabeth, Polly, Jenny, Suley, Nancy, Miley, Lewis, John, Samuel, Susanna, Lucy and Pamelly and whereas my wife Susanna is now in a State of Pregnancy, I also desire that the child of which she may be delivered, shall have to the amount of one hundred and four Dollars out of my Estate in like manner as the rest of my Children as heretofore mentioned and in all respects touching this my last will and Testament to be made equal with the rest of my Children.

Item 5th I give unto my wife Susanna all the residue of my Estate Real and personal during her natural life for the purpose of Supporting her and Raising the Children, all of which it is

My desire she shall have the use of Freely for the benefit of herself and the Children, whatever change of Circumstances may take place, so that in the opinion of the Executors herein after named the Estate may not be so managed as to be in danger of being profusely wasted, but if contrary to my Expectations the Estate should at any time in the opinion of said Executors be so endangered in such case it is my desire that the said Executors shall immediately proceed to dispose of said Estate in the same manner the Law would have directed had I have died intestate.

Item 6th provided also that if in the Opinion of said Executors the respective sums above given to the Legatees should be greater than the Estate can with propriety spare from the support of the family, it is my desire that the said Executors may Reduce them to such amount as to them shall

reasonable at the same time making them equall to each and every one of the Legatees herebefore named.

Now I desire that after the decease of my wife Susanna my Executors proceed to sell so soon as to them shall seem proper all the rest of my Estate both Real and personal of whatsoever nature or kind it may be not herein before particularly disposed of, and the proceeds thereof to be equally divided among my several children herein before named which I give to them their heirs Executors, Administrators and assigns forever. and lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends John Holland, John P.
