In the name of God amen, I John Booth of Franklin County and State of Virginia being weak in body but of disposing mind and memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, first I give all my Just debts shall be paid, secondly, I desire my Daughter Agnes Clardy, and my sons Richard Booth Peter Booth, John Booth, Stephen Booth, and my Daughter Mary Guttry shall have one shilling Sterling a piece, Thirdly, I give to my son Benjamin Booth the Tract of Land I now live on containing four hundred acres by survey also Fifty six acres of Land lying in Bedford County on the north side of Stanton River to him and his heirs forever, and fourthly I give to my son Thomas Booth one feather Bed and furniture the rest of my Estate both Real and personal I give shall be held in Trust by Peter Booth of the State of Virginia or by Stephen Booth of the State of Tennessee and the profits thereof to be applied to the use of Thomas Booth during his life, and after his death to be equally divided among three of his children, to wit, Frances, James & Thomas, and I do hereby ^{appoint} my two sons Peter Booth & Benjamin Booth Executors to this my Last Will and Testament, revoking all others desire this may be received as such, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty sixth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seven

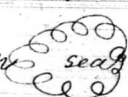

Thirdly I give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Barbary Webb the Tract of Land whereon I live containing Two hundred and twenty acres, more or less, also one half of my Stock & the one half of my house hold furniture to her & her heirs forever. Fourthly I give and bequeath unto My second Wife Daughter Mary Rogers the other half of all my Stock & her household furniture to her & her heirs forever, and lastly I nominate constitute & appoint my Trusty friends Swinfield Hill and his Son John Hill Executors to this my Last Will & Testament Signed & acknowledged this twenty seventh day of June 1797
