In pursuance of an order of the Worshipful Court of Franklin to us directed, We have divided the Real Estate of John Dickenson deceased between his children agreeable to the allotments hereafter specified

1st We do allot to Joseph Dickenson all the lands on the South side Big River belonging to the Estate of John Dickenson deceased within the Grants as follows. One hundred and sixty two acres by Patent bearing date 31st March 1786, and all on the North side belonging to patent dated 1st February 1781, also on the North side of said River belonging to a patent bearing date 1st day March 1781, and one hundred fifty two acres by Deed from Lansford Hall bearing date 9th November 1789, and on the South side of said River part of a patent bearing date 1st February 1781, and part of the Tract called Isham Gorges within the bounds as follows. (viz.) Beginning on the South side of the River on a Sycamore tree at the mouth of a Branch, thence up the said Branch as it meanders to a White Oak, thence South four degrees East sixty nine poles to pointers on the Road leading from Gallaways Iron Works to James Pattersons, thence South fifty two degrees East eighty six poles to pointers on a Ridge, thence along the Ridge South fifty one degrees West one hundred and fourteen poles to a chestnut tree, South thirty five degrees West sixty six poles to a beach on the Bank Chemunk Creek, thence up the Creek as it meanders to Andrew Pattersons line, thence North thirty five degrees East fifteen poles to pointers, North sixty one degrees West one hundred and forty poles to a Red Oak, North twenty five degrees East two hundred and eight poles to a White Oak near a Branch in Pattersons line, North fifty degrees West thirty six poles to a White Oak, North twenty five degrees East fifty four poles crossing two branches to a post oak, North fourteen & half degrees East twenty poles to a post oak, North Seventy Seven & half degrees East fifty six poles to a post oak, North forty four degrees East twenty six poles to a Spanish Oak, South eighty two degrees East forty poles crossing a Branch to a Sprucewood on the Bank of River, The whole containing Seven hundred and eighteen acres. Valued to Three hundred and sixty pounds - also one Tract in Henry County on the head of Leatherwood containing one thousand and sixty three acres by patent bearing date 16th April 1781 valued to three hundred and eighteen pounds eighteen shillings. Also one Tract in Franklin County on Story Creek containing six hundred and fifty six acres by Patent bearing date 16th November 1779 valued to one hundred and ninety six pounds sixteen shillings - making in whole Eight hundred and seventy five pounds fourteen shillings -

Secondly, we do allot to Robert Dickenson the home Tract containing five hundred and forty acres, and bounded as follows viz. (Beginning on the South side Big River on a Sycamore at the mouth of a Branch) thence up the said Branch as it meanders to a White Oak, thence South four degrees East sixty nine poles to pointers on the road leading from Gallaways Iron Works to James Pattersons, thence South fifty two degrees East eighty six poles to pointers on a Ridge, thence North sixty seven degrees East Seventy four

poles to a red oak on the road leading to James Pattersons, thence down the said Road South seventy five degrees East one hundred and ninety eight poles to Pattersons line, thence with his line to Woodalls corner Poplar near Pig River, thence North thirty four degrees West Eighty six poles to a post oak, North eighty three degrees West thirty eight poles to a chestnut on Pig River, thence up the same as it meanders to the Beginning. Valued to five hundred and thirty pound also one Tract on the Coal Branch of Black Water in Franklin County containing four hundred and sixty six acres by Patent bearing date 20th June 1780 Valued to two hundred & nine pound fourteen shillings, also one Tract in Henry County on the head branches of the Rocky fork of Sandy River containing Four hundred acres by patent bearing date 1st October 1791 valued to sixty pounds, also one other Tract in Henry County on the head of Leatherwood containing three hundred and eight acres by patent bearing date 7th July 1780 Valued to thirty two pound eight shillings making in the whole Eight hundred and ninety two pound two shillings.

Thirdly, and Lastly, We do allot to John Clay Wife one Tract Land in Franklin County on Chestnut Creek. Beginning on a Beach the North side Chestnut Creek, thence north thirty five degrees East sixty six poles to a chestnut tree, North fifty one degrees East one hundred and fourteen poles along a ridge to pointiers, North sixty seven degrees East seventy four poles to a Red oak on the Road leading to James Pattersons, South seventy five degrees East one hundred & ninety eight poles along the road to James Pattersons line, thence with his line to Chestnut Creek, and all the Lands joining and belonging to the Estate of John Dickinsson on the South side of said Creek supposed to be seven hundred and twenty acres, Valued to eight hundred and twelve pound, also one Tract in Henry County on Leatherwood joining the Lands of Francis Cox containing two hundred & fifty seven acres by patent bearing date 1st May 1784 Valued to thirty eight pound, five shillings making in the whole Eight hundred & fifty pound five shillings.

At the request of Josiah Woods Son of John Dickenson we have allotted to John Clay Wife one Tract of sixty six acres Land on the Bushy fork of Stuarts Creek in Patrick County by patent bearing date the 10th day of September 1780. and also all the Lands to which John Dickinsson Sen. would have been entitled to as being heir at Law to the Land of his father in Hanover County for the purpose that the said Clay may make sale of the same and render unto Josiah Woods Arsen. the whole proceeds of such sales.
