In the name of God Amen, I John Edds of Franklin County & Commonwealth of Virginia being weak in body, but of perfect sense & sound memory, do make my last Will & Testament, my Will & desire is that my just debt be paid, then what worldly goods, it hath been please God to bless me with, I here distribute in manner & form following, First of all I will my soul to God that gave it, I also give & bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Edds my Land & Plantation during her life or Widowhood, Also a Negro Girl that is call young Lucy, during the same & after the death of my beloved wife Mary Edds the Plantation Land Negro Lucy & Increase is to be sold & Equally divided with all my sons and Daughters one one them I wish a redirection ~~instead of part of what~~ I have already give into a part of my sons & Daughters which will or may be found in my Papers after my Death, I also bequeath unto my beloved wife my House hold & belongings for ever term together with the Stock during the time above mentioned and then to be sold and equally divided with my children I also give & bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Edds my Negro man Bob & Negro woman Jane during her life or Widowhood, then sold & equally divided with my children, I also give unto my Daughter Lucinda Edds one half named my Daughter

 my trusty friend, George Gillbert, my Executors & Executor, and this
 my last will & Testament, Revoking all Wills here before made
