In the name of God amen I John Starkey being sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, and knowing it is appointed for all men to die, do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament, and first it is my desire that all my Just Debts should be paid, and then I lend to my beloved Wife Polly Starkey two feather Beds and Trimmings one cow and calf with all my house and Kitchen furniture during her natural life. To raise and School my Children with, and at her decease to be Equally divided amongst all my children hereafter mentioned, and it is my Desire that my Executors hereafter named should sell the Land whereon I now live, with all my Stock of horses, cattle and Hogs, Corn except five Barrels, wheat except five Bushels, Rice and peaches with all my plantation tools the and the profits of the above sales to be Equally divided amongst my children, Justice Starkey, John Starkey, Maria Starkey, and Joshua Starkey when they shall arrive at age or married, and lastly, constitute and appoint, George Boismann and John Hoop Executors to this my Last Will and Testament, and I do declare this and no other to be my last will and Testament hereby utterly revoke and disannul all other Wills and Testaments. In Witness whereof I have here set my hand and seal, this 29<sup>th</sup> day of January 1807
