Wife ally Wadd one third part of all my Personal Estate, together
with third Part of the Land whereon I now live for which I have
a bond of Joel Ragland for a Title during her natural Life and I
direct my Executors to use all lawful means to Recover a title for said Tract
of Land agreeable to said Raglands Bond for my two sons Bradley and
Anderson Wadd only Reserving my wife dower to her during her natural
Life and to my son John Wadd I Give and bequeath one dollar to be
paid out of my Estate, and the rest of my Estate I desire to be
Equally divided Between my sons Cestus Wadd Royal Wadd Bradley
Wadd and Anderson Wadd and my daughters Susanna Hale Dorothea
Troupe, and Mary Wadd, only my daughters Susanna Hale and Dorothea
Troupe, shall allow out of their shares ten dollars Each for a Pew,
five to Each of them, formerly, only one more and bid not to be
sold, but my wife to have it as part of her In. and I also
Constitute, appoint and ordain Thomas Jones Junr & William
Mear my whole and sole Executors of this my Last Will Last Will
and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal this 27th day of September 1798.
