once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
that is to say in the first place, I recommend my soul into the hands
of god, that gave it and my body to the Earth, to be decently Buried
at the discretion of any as touching such worldly goods wherewithal
the hatt pleased god in his mercy to bless me, I give demise and
dispose of the same in the following manner and form to wit
First I direct my Executors to pay all my Just debts and funeral
Expences out of my Personal Estate, Secondly I give unto my beloved
Wife ally Wade one third part of all my Personal Estate together
with third Part of the Land wherein I now live for which I have
a bond of Joel Ragland for a Title during her natural life and I
direct my Executors to use all lawful means to recover a title for said Tract
of Land agreeable to said Raglands Bond for my two sons Bradley and
Anderson Wade only Reserving my wife's power to her during her natural
life and to my son John Wade I Give and bequeath one dollar to be
paid out of my Estate and the rest of my Estate I desire to be
Equally divided Between my sons Left to Wade Royal Wade Bradley
Wade and Andrew Wade and my daughters Susanna Hale Dorothea
Troup, and Mary Wade, only my daughters Susanna Hale and Dorothea
Troup shall allow out of their share ten dollars Each for a Cw
given to Each of them, formerly only one more and less not to be
less but my wife to have it as part of her Int and I also
constitute Appoint and ordain Thomas Jones Junr & William
Atch my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Test
and Testamente In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and affixed my seal this 27th day of September 1798.
