and Testament, hereby revoking all Wills by me before-  
named, in the following manner &c<sup>t</sup> I would recommend  
my Soul to Almighty God, who gave it existence, and that  
my body be decently buried at the discretion of my executors  
hereafter named & that all my just Debts be paid  
3rd<sup>r</sup> That my whole Estate both Real and Personal be divided  
among my loving Wife Jane Choice and my four children  
namely, Folly Choice, Gresham Choice, Elizabeth Choice  
and John McChoice, agreeably to the now existing Laws of  
Virginia, with this exception that it shall all remain  
in the possession of my wife until my oldest son becomes  
of the age of twenty one years old, at which time he shall  
draw his share of my estate, agreeable to above provision  
of this my last Will and Testament, and that my other  
children, above named draw their respective shares as  
they become of lawful age, and finally whatever may  
remain of my estate in the hands of my wife at her decease  
be equally divided among my four children above named,  
if they are living, if not to their lawful heirs, agreeable  
to the Laws of the State, as above mentioned. 4th<sup>r</sup> Justly  
I appoint my friends Robert Innes & George Peavy executors to  
this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof, I
