Woodall John's Will &c
In the name of God Amen, I John Woodall of the County
of Franklin and State of Virginia, being in a low State of Health,
but of sound mind and memory, and knowing it is aloted for
all men once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last
Will & Testament, in manner and form hereafter specified
first I do recommend my Soul to God and my Body to be decently
Buried, and touching such worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased
God to Bless with, I Bequeath and give the same as follows

To my beloved wife Annina all I possess during
her life or widowhood and at her Death to be sold to the highest
Bidder, and in the first place for my Daughter Jane to have
Thirty pounds out of the same as a present for her particular
attention to me ever and also her equal share hereafter mentioned,
also for my son Christopher Woodall to have Twenty pounds out
of the same over and above his equal Legacy hereafter mentioned
and after the sums mentioned and given to my daughter Jane
& Christopher Woodall, that the whole Ballance of my Estate
should be equally and fairly divided between my children viz
David Woodall, William Woodall, Eliza Kirby, Judith Hall, Jane
Woodall & Christopher Woodall and whereas David Woodall has
received of my Estate Seventy pounds and at the death of my wife
and sale of my Estate both Real & Personall & the two Legacies to Jane
& Christopher paid; out of David Woodall's share of the Ballance,
my will is that the above mentioned Seventy pounds be deducted
and he receive the ballance, also William Woodall my son has
been paid out of my Estate Eighty pounds which is to be deducted in
like manner from his equal share, also my Daughter Judith Hall
has had Twelve pounds which is likewise to be deducted out of her
equal Legacy as before mentioned and also my Daughter Eliza
