It is my Wish and desire that the whole of the property which I may possess may be kept together in the hands of my Wife and Executors for the purpose of Educating my children. It is my Wish that my Negro man beaser, and wholly, may be sold by my Executors and the money arising from the Sale thereof to be layed out in the purchase of Young Negroes, either boys, or girls as my Executors may deem most proper, if it should be thought by my Executors, that it would be most beneficial to my family to sell, but one of the above named Negroes, they are at liberty to use their discretion and to dispose of which they please. Secondly - As my wife has a Brother and some other friends residing in the State of Georgia, it is probable she may have a desire to remove there, or else where, if that should be the case, this

I now desire may be sold, and the money, arising therefrom may be
 appropriated in any manner that my Executors may think most
 beneficial to my family, Thirdly It is wish that my Executors
 shall make a title to John Johnson for a small Tract of Land
 sold him, upon his making payment for the same, the sum he was
 to give, for the above land is one hundred and thirty three Dollars
 Eighty three of which he has already paid me. Lastly I appo-
 int my friends John John S. Burwell and Rich^d. M. Telferners
 of the above named County and State, likewise, Marcus Mutton and
 John Houston of Morgan County Georgia, my Executors, I have
 merely named the Gentlemen Residing in Georgia, as my Execu-
 tors, in case my wife should remove from Virginia. if that should
 be the case, the Executors there, must give a complete Recon-
 vention to those appointed in this State, before the State is removed
 hence. In case my wife should Marry again, and it should
 appear to my Executors, that the property is in a fair way
 to be wasted, it is wish and desire that my Executors should allot
