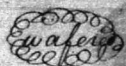
In the name of God Amen The twenty first Day of November
1804 I Jonathan Price of the County of Franklinⁱⁿ the state of being in
decline of life but in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to
God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and
first of all I give and recommend my soul in hands of Almighty God
who gave it and my Bod recommend the Earth to buried in a
decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors not doubting
but at the General resurrection I shall receive it again by the
mighty power of God and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
it has pleas'd God to bless me in this life I give demise and
dispose of in the following manner and form First I give and
bequeath to Sarah my dearly beloved Wife all that part of my
Land lying on the West of a line basely mark'd beginning at White
Oak in Cap: Lunsdens line mark'd 1804 thence down hill to a
small Spring head thence down said Spring branch ^{to a small branch} near the fence
thence easiwardly near the fence to two sycamore sapling thence crop the
field ~~above the~~ ^{to a small branch} ~~orchard~~ to a big branch at at a small
Spring then up the branch to white Oak at a Spring head thence
a new line to a white oak nicely mark'd ~~at a corner in~~
Athens line I say all that I possz west and north of said described lines
to gether with all and improvements that are thereon and profits and
enjoyments that may accrue thereto without Let impediment or
molestation to gether with all my goods chattels and moveable property
excepting only what shall be hereafter excepted during her life And
to my son David Price I give and bequeath that part of whereon
he now lives it being east of the above described lines to said
sycamores thence to an ash sapling at the o Tobacco house thence
to a steep bank of the branch thence from the white oak at the
brink of the water by a level a steep bank where is an iron rock
thence with to the River and as my lines to the place of Beginning
to be his sole and rightful property to have and to hold to him his

heirs and assigns for ever and to my son Jonathan Price I give
^{bequeath} all that part of my Land lying being north and east of the above
 discribed to be his sole and proper Right to have and to hold to him
 his heirs and assigns for ever. Further it is my Will that such
 of my children that have not been furnish'd with a bed and a
 cow shall be supply'd out of my personal property at their Marriage
 or leaving the family. And as according to my estimation my son
 Evan Price has already receiv'd an ample part I give as a
 memorial Wesley's History of England. As to my Daughter Letitia
 I Will that she live with her with her mother but should survive
 her she may choose with which of her brothers or sisters to live
 with who possess a part of my Land and that the others who also
 possess shall render to the one with whom she resides the sum of
 six dollars if required for year during her life and it is my
 Will that after their mothers death that she in her life time
 is her dower be divided by beginning at Jonathan's at the branch
 and follow the branch till it leaves the bank then the edge of
 the bank to a poplar and ash then cross the branch a swamp
 to ~~the bank~~ on the other side thence to a white oak in the
 hollow mark'd 1804 thence to a grey rock in Dudley Pundens
 line this line to be a division between my Daughter Eleanor
 she having the preference of choice and my Daughter Sarah Ellison
 the one who has the Lot the house is on shall to my Daughter
 Anne the sum sixty pounds in in six annual payments
 and the other shall pay to my Daughter Mary Keagin the sum
 of fifty in five in five annual payments and when the above
 are fulfilled the above discribed Land is confirmed to them to have
 and to hold them their heirs and assigns for ever. And as to what
 personal property may be in the hands of Sarah my dearly beloved
 Wife at her death be it at her disposal. And as my sister Mary
 Davis has a claim of sixteen - on I lay it on my four above
 as land land holder to pay her four pounds apiece. And I do
 constitute make and ordain Sarah my dearly beloved Wife and
 David Price my son joint Executors to this my last Will and

374 Testament and do hereby utterly disannul revoke and disdoe all and every other former Testaments Wills Legacies and Bequests Executed by me in any way before named Wills or bequeathes Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.
