 ness of God, tho weak in body, yet of sound & perfect understand
 ing and memory, do constitute this my last Will & Testament
 and desire it may be received by all as such, that is to say; princi
 pally and first of all, I Give & recommend my Soul, into the hands
 of Almighty God, that gave it, & my Body I recommend to the
 Earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion
 of my Executor, nothing doubting but at the general

254 Resurrection. I shall receive the same again by the
power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate which
it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give, demise,
dispose of the same in the following manner & form, First I
Will bequeath unto my eldest Daughter, Betsey one Dollar
I also will to my second Daughter Polly one Dollar, I also
give to my son Peter one Dollar, I also Will bequeath
to my third son Thomas Ringery one dollar, I also Will
and bequeath unto my daughter Abby Ringery, one hundred
and fifty dollars lawful money of Virginia, to be paid out
of what I have left to my son Henry or out of his part of my
Estate, Also I give to my well beloved son Henry Ringery
whome I likewise constitute make and ordain the sole
Executor of this my last Will and Testament, all and singular
my Lands Meriages and Tenements, Bonds, Bills, Goods and
Chattles, and house hold Furniture of all & every kind without
distinction, by him freely to be disposed and enjoyed,
and I do hereby utterly disavow, revoke and disannul all
& every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, Bequests
& Executors, by me in any wise before named, Willed and
bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this & no other to be
my last Will & Testament Given under my hand & Seal
this 12 day of December Eighteen hundred & Eighteen
