Dec^d was proved by the oath of Isiah W. Dickerson
and John J. Moorman two of the subscribing witnesses
hereto and Ordered to be Recorded.

Webster In the name of God amen I Luke Webster of Franklin
County and State of Virginia, Calling to mind the
uncertainty of Human Life, and being desirous to
dispose of all such worldly Estate as it has pleased God
to bestow me with, first I desire that all my Estate
stay and continue together as it now and to be managed
by my Executors till all my just debts be paid
and then my Estate to be Divided in the following
manner that is to say, Equally between my sons and
Daughters all except Margaret Phillips whose part is
to go to her children, to my Son John Webster after
deducting from his part, one hundred and ninety five
pounds which he has Received in advance, to my Son
Henry Webster after deducting from his part one
hundred and ninety pounds which he has Received
in advance, to my daughter Lucy Akers after
deducting from her part one negro her own named
Nancy as Eighty pounds which she has Received
in advance, to Daughter Sally Phillips after

deducting from her part one Negro Girl named Lide at
 pounds which she has received in advance. To Daughter Rebecca
 Ains after deducting from her part one Negro boy named Daniel
 at Eighty pounds, I Give unto my son Joseph Webster & Daniel
Webster the Land whereon I now live of 50 Acres & 70 Acres.
 the old place 100 Acres called How's place 265 a new survey
 183 Acres part of the Land I bought of Hustan and the Land
 I bought of Killers Ains to be equally divided between them
 and if they can't agree upon the Division to be Divided by three
 honest disinterested men to be chosen by Executors, which is
 to be deducted out of their part of my Estate at two hundred
 and sixty seven pounds each. I give to my son Luke Webster
 the Land I bought of Librock containing 700 Acres 156 Acres &
 68 Acres at four hundred pounds to be deducted out of
 his part of my Estate, I Give unto my Daughter Dosha
Webster a Negro boy named Charles at Eighty pounds to
 be deducted out of her part of my Estate and in addition
 to which I have given to my Daughter Lissey a Negro Girl
 named Silvey for her trouble in taking care of my daughter
Dosha also 100 Acres of Land it being the lower end of the
 Tract of Land I purchased of Hustan at fifty pounds
 to be deducted out of her part of my Estate and in case
 the said Negro Girl Silvey should die before the Division, then
 the said Lissey is to receive and other Negroes of the same
 value out my Estate, and if my Daughter Dosha should continue
 with my Daughter Lissey till her Death, then in that case the
 said Lissey is to receive the part that shall come to my Daugh-
 ter Dosha, I Give unto my Grand son Nathaniel Webster son
 of Dosha Webster fifty Dollars and one hundred Dollars
 to be paid to them that has and my raise him the rates
 of fifteen Dollars a year, and the Balance of my Estate
 to be Equally Divided between John Webster, Lissey Ains,
Henry Webster, Samah Phillips, Dosha Webster, Rebecca Ains,
Joseph Webster, Daniel Webster, Luke Webster, and the balance

174 has been recorded and in case the said Richard Billips should die before my Daughter Margaret Billips then the said Margaret Billips is to enjoy the part of my Estate that comes to her children during her life and then to Return to her children and my said Estate is to be Divided in such a manner as each of my children shall have an Equal share of my Estate all Except my Daughter Margaret whose part is to go her children counting in what each one has Received and what is Specialy mentioned so as David Luke & Joshua shall receive one bed and furniture, cow and calf each, it is also my Will and desire that Richard Billips shall have no part of my Estate, Real nor personal, and in case any dispute should arise about the Division of my Estate that my heirs shall not go to Law but leave it to men to settle and divide for them and lastly I appoint John Webster Jr and James Akers Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby Revoking all other Wills by me made.
