Mind & memory thanks be to God for the same (calling to mind the
Mortality of my body & knowing it is appointed unto man once to die
do make this my Last Will & Testament in manner & form following To-wit:
First it is my Desire that all my just debts should be paid; Then I give
to my Wife Mary Agre One third of all my Estate both real & personal
Estate I give to my Son Ephraim; Children two Dollars to be paid
Out of my Estate, to my said Son having been provided for heretofore
Then I give to my Daughter Rebecca Jones two Dollars to be paid Out
of my Estate she also having been previously provided for by me
Then I give my son A. Agre One hundred acres of Land, it being a portion
of a part of the tract of Land on which I now live the my late son A.
having been provided with other property. Then I give to my Daughter Polly
Eighty One hundred acres of Land on which she now lives the also
having rec^d other property. Then I give to my son Levi Agre, One
hundred acres of Land on which he now lives of other property he heretofore
Then I give to my son Matthew One hundred acres of Land which I have
already conveyed to him of being the said tract he dole to Garrett
P other property he heretofore. Then I give to my son Asa One hundred
acres of Land on which I now live, also other property heretofore
him. Then I give to my Daughter Judith all the remaining part of
my Land on which I live but should there not be a sufficient
quantity to make her equal with the rest she is to be made equal
Out of my other property. Then I give to my son Isaac Agre
One hundred acres of Land on the South side of Blackwater*

in which he now lives also if he shall think proper he shall have the balance of the said allotment to the said tract on which he now lives one of above One hundred acres provided he shall pay a reasonable compensation for the same then I give to my Daughter Sally Macey One hundred acres of land it being a part of the tract on which my son Isaac resides on the following condition: provided James Macey shall pay or caused to be paid to my Daughter Polly Craighead a sum of money which he the said James Macey borrowed of my said Daughter Polly some time ago in the event of the said James Macey not refunding the money borrowed of my said Daughter on or before the 20th December next. Thus it is my desire that the said said land intended for my Daughter Sally Macey shall be publicly sold after giving a reasonable notice of such sale & the money arising from the sale thereof shall be paid to my Daughter Polly Craighead or so much thereof as shall be sufficient to refund to her the amount borrowed by the said Macey And witness whereoff I have hereunto set my hand this 10th day of April 1823

At a Court held for Franklin County at the Courthouse the third day November 1871

Then Last Will and Testament of Matthew Agar deceased was proved by the oath of Bernard G. Hendricks and Peter Bernard two of the Witnesses here and ordered to be recorded.

And at a Court held for said County the 8th day of June 1871 no executor being appointed in the said Will, and Henry Agar the Widow and relict of the said deceased, declaring he Qualify as administrator on the motion of An Agar who made Oath and together with James Henry Agar and John Fiqueroa his securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the sum of eight Hundred Dollars conditioned as the Law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining Letters of administration on the said Decedents estate with his will annexed in due form.
