In the Name of God Amen I Nicholas Capall of Franklin County and the County of Virginia being awake in Body But of perfect mind and understanding and to mind the uncertainty of life and that it is appointed that all must Die do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament for the purpose of disposing of what worldly goods Providence has Blesst me with in the following manner to wit, first I Direct that my Executors give me a Decent Burial and pay all my just Debts and Funeral Expences, Then I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife Elizabeth the possession of all my Lands and Tenements and also all my personal Estate of Every kind consisting of Negroes Horses Cattle Sheep and Hogs as also Househould and Kitchen Furniture and Employments of husbandry with and all profits arising therefrom she in the mean time To Support my three Children till they come to the age of Twenty one years, provided never the less that If she should Marry before my son John Capall comes to the age of Twenty one years in that case she is to take her Dower in the Lands and Tenements above mentioned to be included in the following Buriall (to wit) Beginning at the top of the Ridge opposit Charles Greer's Spring in said Capall's Line thence with the Ridge to the Dog Horn Ridge to William Jones's Line and thence on my Back Line to the beginning I also further Direct that on her marrying at any time she shall give up to my Executors two thirds of all my personal property in her hands Except the two negro women Fanny and Frances to the Benefit of my Children but in case she should not Marry the Division of said Line is not to be made till my son John Capall comes of age at which time it is to be made as before mentioned also I give to my said Wife Two Negro women to wit, Fanny and Frances all of which I give to her During her Natural life with the Exception of one Howard I allow hereafter to be bequeath to my two Daughters which I Direct to be under the Direction of my Executors for the purpose aforesaid Then I give and bequeath to my son John Capall three Negro Boys to wit, Joseph Lewis and David also after my wife Deceas the negro woman Fanny and her Increase from this Date to him and his heirs for ever Then I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Capall Two Negroes girls named Mancey and Luckey also after my Wife Deceas a negro woman named Frances and one half of her increase from this Date also five hundred Dollars as above mentioned to her and her heirs for ever she to Receive the same at her being of Twenty one years of age Then I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Capall Two negro girls named Susey and Filly also Two hundred Dollars as above mentioned and one Equil Half of the Increase of a negro woman named Frances bequeath to her and her heirs for ever she to Receive the same at her being of Twenty one years of age

Then I give to my beloved Wife Elizabeth all my lands and Tenements that I may die possessed of as also one milk Cow any one she may chose out of my stock also one feather Bed and furniture, also the Move that I owe use during her natural life, as also as much Cash of the Crop now on hand as will be sufficient for her support for one year. its is further my desire that all bonds and Accounts that I may die possessed of, that my Executors shall collect, and that with any money that may be on hand shall remain in the hands of Executors to be given to my wife Elizabeth as she shall stand in need thereof. Then after my Decease all my property not here in before mentioned, shall be sold by my Executors and the money arising from such sale is also to remain in their hands to be given to my wife as she may stand in need thereof provided however that if my wife should hereafter Marry then my Estate to be divided as here in after named. ~~Then after the decease of my wife its my desire that all my lands be~~ sold together with the articles bequeathed to my Wife during her life be also sold and the monies arising from such sale together with any monies that may remain in the hands my Executors to be equally divided between my seven children Robert John, Jacob, Henry, Peter, Daniel and Tamer.
