In the Name of God amen, October 19th 1800. I Peter Feller of Franklin County being weak in body, but of perfect mind and memory, and calling to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for ^{all} men to die, do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz

First it is my desire that all my just debts should be paid, and I lend to my beloved Wife Caty Feller all my real & personal Estate, during her natural life or Widowhood, and at her death, or marriage to be disposed of by my Executors hereafter named in manner and form following. Item I give to my son Lawrence Feller twenty two pounds ten shillings to be raised out of my Estate. Item it is my desire that the feather bed, the Cow and Saddle that I let my Daughter Susanna Starkey have, that she should keep and enjoy the same. Item it is my desire that at the death or marriage of my beloved wife Caty Feller all the rest of my Estate real and personal may be equally divided betwixt the rest of my Children, Eve Feller, John Feller, Peter Feller, Magdalene Feller, and Betsey Feller, to them and their heirs for ever. Item I also appoint Robert Pasley and my son Lawrence Feller Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly revoke and disannul all other Wills and Testaments by me at any time made declaring this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.
