P. Gearhart
1802

In the name of God Amen. I Peter Gearhart of Franklin County & State of Virginia Blacksmith, being advanced in years and weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind, memory, and understanding, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do see cause to make this my last Will and Testament, that is to say, principally and first I commend my Soul to God, and my body to the Grave to be buried in a christian like manner at the discretion of my wife and Executors, and as touching such worldly goods wherewith God blessed me in this life, I dispose of the same in the following manner and form, to wit, It is my will & I do order that all my lawful debts, funeral expences, and Doctors Charges shall be paid & lawfully discharged. I will and bequeath unto my wife Margaret Gearhart all my Land and Stock, Household Furniture and Farming Tools during her Widowhood, except what I shall hereafter bequeath to my Daughter Susanna I will bequeath unto my four sons that is to wit Peter, Felly, William & Thomas fifteen pounds each each, to be paid to them out of my Cash, and the balance thereof to be let on interest for the use of my wife, which with my Slaves she shall have during her Widowhood. I bequeath unto my four sons Peter, Felly, William and Thomas ^{all my land} after my wife's decease, or during her name, to be divided equally between them. I bequeath unto my Daughter Susanna as much of my property before any sale or division is made, as any of my Daughters that is married has had, when she is married, or of lawful age. I bequeath unto the Heirs of my son Henry Gearhart deceased five shillings Cash to be paid to them on demand by my Executors (whom I shall hereafter nominate). It is my will, and I do order that all my moveable property and ^{my} Slaves shall be sold by my Executors after my wife's decease or marriage, and the price thereof to be divided equally among my Children, that is Leonard, Christine, Mary, Peter, Felly, Hannah - William, Thomas, and Susanna; and I do hereby nominate and appoint my beloved sons Peter Gearhart and Felly Gearhart, to be the Executors of this my last Will and Testament, giving them full power and authority to act do, and cause to be done, all and every thing, or things inserted in this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I the said Peter Gearhart do hereunto set my hand and Seal, this twenty fourth day of April, in year one thousand eight hundred and two

And on the motion of Peter Gearhart and Betty Gearhart the Executors herein named, who made oath, and together with Daniel Pritchard and Isaac Wallis their securities entered into and acknowledged their Bonds in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditions according to Law, Certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate in due form.

Wray } In the name of God Amen I Moses Wray of Franklin County & State of Virginia being weak of body sound in memory, bless^d be God for all his mercies, and knowing the frailty of the body, I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner as followeth, First of all I commend my spirit into the hands of God that gave it, and my body to the dust, to be buried at the discretion of my friends, and Executors, and I allow all my lawfull debts to be paid, and next I make and ordain my well beloved wife Elizabeth Wray my first Executor, and my well beloved son Moses Wray my other Executor, next I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth Wray all my Horse beasts, and cattle, and Hogs, and all my bearing and furniture together with all my Household furniture to dispose of at her own discretion. I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Moses Wray, Elijah Wray, John Wray, Wm Wray, Andrew Wray, Isaac Wray, all the Lands that I possessed, except my wife Dowry or thirds, to be sold, and equally divided after the decease of my well beloved wife Elizabeth Wray, I also give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Wray ten shilling, and give and bequeath to my well beloved son Benjamin Wray ten shilling, also I give and bequeath to my well beloved son Daniel Wray ten shilling I also give and bequeath to my well beloved son Ezekiel Wray ten shilling, George Wray I give and bequeath ten shilling, I also give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Mary Wright ten shillings, also give bequeath to my well beloved Tabitha Wright ten shilling, also give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Rebecca ten shilling, I also give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Margaret James ten shilling, I also give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Elizabeth Wray ten shilling, also I give and bequeath to my well beloved Daughter Geny Wray ten shilling I empower the above Executors to fullfill this my last Will and Testament I disannul all former Wills and Testaments whatsoever. Given under my hands and seal this twenty fifth day of April 1802.
