pleased God to bless me with do make my will and Testament
in the following manner To wit, first I desire that all my
lawful debts be paid. second I give unto my son ^{and daughter} John Black, the
land whereon my son John now lives, John to have one hundred acres
including the buildings at five Dollars per acre and Samuel Black
seventy five acres at three Dollars per acre I give unto my son
Michael Black one hundred and fifty acres including the old
plantation and buildings at five Dollars per acre, I give unto my
son Jacob Black 75 acres at the upper end of my land at three
Dollars per acre and the said Michael Black is to furnish his
father and mother with what grain and meat and necessaries
of life that they may want at the market price which is to come
out of the price of his land willed to him and to furnish
them with two cows while they may be able to live and to furnish
