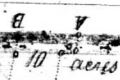

At a Court held for Franklin County November 5th 1811

The reasons appearing to the Court, It is ordered that the Surveyor of this County lay off new Bounds for the Jail, or prison of this County so as to include the whole of the buildings attached to the place, and as much of the Town as the Acres will admit of, without regard to the former Bounds Thomas Hill, Peter Saunders for and William Gathorn are to attend and direct him, and that he make report thereof to the Court.

Survey 10 Acres of land at Franklin Court house for the prison Bounds of said County on the 6th day of November 1811.

Beginning at a stake at the back of Saunders Garden thence N. 80 E. 40 poles to a stone near the Clarks office N. 41, 10 10 poles to a locust post in the Town line with it N. 6 E. 24 poles to a locust post, new line N. 53 10 34 poles to a hickory in the said Town line with it N. 5 40 51 poles to a stake, new line west 10 poles to a stake S. 3 W. 10 poles to the first station.
