Inquisition incidental taken at the plantation of Adada Jarratt &c in the County aforesaid the 26th day of April in the 18th year of the Commonwealth, before me Robert James one of the Justices of the peace of the Commonwealth for the County aforesaid, upon the view of the body of Robert a Slave late in the service of Adada Jarratt &c then & there lying Dead & upon the Oaths of Jesse Pruitt Joseph Bishop, John Pinkard Charles Hunt, Peter L. Stockton, Spencer Hagler, Richard Hagler, William Wingfield Christopher Wingfield, Robert Pinkard, William Campbell & Sterling Cooper, Good & Lawful men of the County aforesaid, who being sworn & charged to enquire, on the part of the s^d Commonwealth, when & where & how & after what manner the said Robert came to his death, do say upon their Oaths, that the said Robert on the 25th day of April in the year aforesaid in the County aforesaid, Twit at the plantation of Adada Jarratt &c was found Dead, that he had a bruise above & near the right eye but not sufficient to produce Death, and Died by the Visitation of God, in a natural way & not otherwise, In Witness whereof the aforesaid Magistrate as well as the Jurors aforesaid have to this Inquisition put their seals at the place aforesaid this 26th day of April 1824
