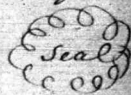

This Last Will and Testament of Alexander Rop deceased was proved by the Oath of Jonathan Richeson one of the Witnesses hereto.

And at about held for the said County October 7<sup>th</sup> 1805

The said Will was further proved by the oath of John Wail and James Wason the two other Subscribing Witnesses hereto, and ordered to be Recorded

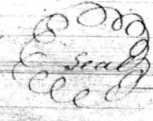
In the name of God Amen. I Robert Napier of the County of Franklin State of Virginia being a weak body though of sound mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed to all men once to die, have made & revised this my Last Will and Testament, wherein first of all I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my body at my decease to be Decently Interred at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, And Touching those worldly goods, whereunto it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and dispose of in manner and form following Viz<sup>t</sup> First of all I lend unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Napier during her Widowhood my house & plantation whereon I now live, and four Negroes by the names of Peter Sarah Judith & Joe likewise my household goods and stock of all kind, during her continuance as above Stated - And after her decease or marriage my desired is that the two Negroes Joe and Sarah should fall into the hands of my two sons Moses & Champion Napier & Paul & John Napier as agents to my son James Napier & my

Daughter Nancy Napier, which property will rest with the two first mentioned <sup>children</sup> during the life of the two last mentioned, in order for their support, and my desire is that after the death of my son James Napier that Negro Joe should fall to my son Valentine Napier. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Napier all that Tract of Land lying on North side of Poplar Camp Creek, whereon I now live, after the death of his mother to be enjoyed by him this heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Moses Chambliss Napier & Tartton Napier and their heirs forever, all that Tract of Land lying on the south side of Poplar Camp Creek to be equally divided between the two, the lower end joining Hollands line to Moses Chambliss and the upper end joining James Wingo & Cochrans lines to my son Tartton Napier. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Robert Napier after the death of my wife Elizabeth my Negro man Jeph

Item I give and bequeath unto my three Daughters Elizabeth, Ester Sarah Law & Polly Whatchers one Dollar each

My Wish & desire is after the death of my wife Elizabeth that the Negro Woman Judith & all my Stock & household furniture should be equally divided between my son Rob<sup>t</sup> & Tartton, Moses & Tartton, Vail & Thomas Napier, and lastly I appoint Moses & Napier & Tartton & Napier my two Sons Executors of this my Last Will & Testament. Thereby revoking all former Wills & Testaments by me made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 29<sup>th</sup> April 1805

At a Court held for Franklin County June 2<sup>d</sup> 1806

This Last Will & Testament of Robert Napier dec<sup>d</sup> was proved by the oath of Tartton Brown, Samuel Cochran & James Wingo the Witnesses hereto and ordered to be recorded: and on the motion of Moses & Napier & Tartton Napier the Executors hereto named who took the oath prescribed by Law and gave bond & security conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted them for obtaining a probate in due form
