I Robert County Sheriff of the County of Franklin State of Virginia being at present Well with sound mind and disposing memory I knowing that it appointed unto man once to die do think to make and ordain this my last and Testament hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made.

I desire that out of the money I may die possessed with also also which may be due me by note or otherwise that all my just debts & funeral expenses be paid and that the surplus if any remain in the hands of my Executor herein after named for the sole purpose and benefit of my beloved wife Frances County 2nd I give and bequeath unto my wife Frances County during her natural life and no longer that part of the tract of land I now live on Vizt. a straight line to be run from a Walnut on the bank of the river to the middle of the race path then up the race path to the waggon Road then up the road to Ashworths and Hutchinsons corner then with Hutchinsons line to Pinthens Branch then down the same as it meanders to Big river then down the river as it meanders to the Beginning

I give and unto my son John County the said Boundary line after the death of his mother to him and his heirs forever also I bequeath unto my daughter Sarah after the death of her mother the following boundary of land Beginning at a Walnut on the bank of the river then running with John Countys line

617 to the river path then down the same to the lower end then a straight
line by the pine stump on the road thence down the road to the ford of the
river thence up the river as it meanders to the beginning also all the land
lying on both sides of mountain creek deeded to me by John Hendley I give to
and her heirs forever 5th I give to my son Robert Prunty and his heirs forever
all the land adjoining John land Sarah Prunty on the north side of Big river
deeded to me by Ashford Napier also a cow and calf and heifer now in his
possession after the death of his mother 6th I give unto my son James Prunty
after the death of his Mother all the land on the south E side of Big river
deeded to me by Ashford Napier Also a cow and calf and a Feather bed
that now in his possession to him and his heirs forever 7th I give unto my
Daughter Sarah Prunty one negro girl called Betty and her increase also one
feather bed and furniture also a boll (black with a blayd face) also a cow and calf
to her and heirs forever 8th It is my will and desire that the Negro girl
called Phoebe that now in the possession of my daughter Jane Prunty
the girl called Dica now in the possession of my Daughter Betty Finney
with the increase should be theirs and their heirs forever also the negro
boy called Moses that now in possession of Jesse Prunty also the Negro
boy called Ben now in possession of Joseph Rivers also a large cupboard
should be theirs & their heirs forever Likewise the girl called Hannah
in possession of Thomas Prunty should with her increase be his and his
heirs forever 9th It is my will and desire that the rest of my negroes
Ulysses Harry Amy Hampton, Murphy Hannah Dick & Rachael
all be sold after my wifes death Harry to choosd his master, and the
money arising from the sale to Equally divided between all my
children 10th It is my will and desire that after the death of my wife
that all the balance of the stock household and kitchen furniture
plantation utensils be sold to the highest bidder and the money arising
therefrom be equally divided between my said children 11th It is my will
and desire that the land belonging to me on Snow Creek be sold
when convenient and the money after the death of my wife be
equally divided between Jesse Prunty John Prunty James Prunty Thomas
Prunty Robert Prunty Jane Prunty Frances Rivers & Sarah Prunty
12th and lastly I do hereby nominate constitute & appoint my son

Paid by Robert Purity Jr as security for David Welles to Dickerson & Shawsbury together with In^r & costs about \$64. This was settled in Robert Purity's life time & by himself. He never showed any disposition that any attempt sh^d be made to collect the same of Welles which makes it very doubtful with the ex^r whether there is any thing due, and if there is Mr. Welles' circumstances makes it very doubtful whether any thing can be made out of him. Mr. Welles shows an acct to the full amount of the sum p^d by S^r Purity for him, part of which account the ex^r has heard S^r Purity acknowledge was just.
