In the name of god Amen. I Robert Shearwood of Franklin
County State of Virginia Do make this my last will and Testament hereby Revoking
all wills by me before made I Desire that this may be Regarded as my last will
I give and my son Samuel Shearwood five Shillings Virginia Currency I give to
my daughter Leah five Shillings I give to my daughter Betty five Shillings
I give to my daughter Polly Hadwin five Shillings I give to the heirs of my Son
Hugh Shearwood five Shillings I give to my daughter Abigail Larwell five Shillings
I give to my son Robert the two hundred acres of Land he has my bond for
also sixty pounds Twenty Bushells of Rye forty Bushells of wheat forty Bushells of
Corn six head of Sheep three hundred weights of pork to his heirs and
I assign forever I give to my daughter Hester ~~Shearwood~~ Bleared faced one
Negro one Negro boy named James the Looking glass that is in my room
I give seven tea spoons to her heirs and assign forever I give to my son Williams
Shearwood the bond he gave me for a Negro Jack also a mare I had of
Tince a Rifle gun Wilmouth Board gun to him his heirs and assign forever
I give to my son Thomas Shearwood the tract of Land I live on after
my son Roberts is laid off one Negro Woman Keat one gray horse one Bleared
faced Mare one Bay horse & two all other stock as shall make out a Team
for the Waggon also my Waggon gear and all my house hold and Kitchen Furni-
ture I also give him half my stock of Cattle Hogs & Sheep to him
his heirs and assign forever I give to my grandson Robert Shearwood
son of Thomas Shearwood the Cattle that come of the Bleared faced Mare
and six head of Sheep all the remaining part of my estate not otherwise
given I desire it may be equally Dvided between my three sons Robert Shear-
wood & William Shearwood & only that my son Robert Shearwood shall
have my large billie Lummie and appoint Hugh James and Tho-
mas Shearwood Executors of this my last will and Before the last Division
takes place I give my son Thomas Shearwood sixty pounds out
of Debts that may be due me or due to be made out of the Estate
to be Dvided among my three sons I Witness Thomas I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my Seal this 13th day of October 1794

In the name of god amen I Jacob Pullman sen^r of the County of Franklin
 and State of Virginia being sick and weak of Body but of sound Mind &c
 Mournfully thanks be to god for his mercies calling unto mind the mortality
 of my body & that is appointed for all men once to die do make and
 Ordain this my last will and testament that is to say Principally
 & first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty god,
 that gave it, and my body to the Earth to be buried at the discretion
 of my Executors nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again
 by the mighty power of god. And as touching such worldly goods
 as it hath pleased god to bless me I give and devise and dispose
 of the same in the following manner and form Viz
 First I desire that my just & able funeral Expenses be first paid out of
 my Estate & secondly I give unto my Wife Hallburgilly Pullman after
 the payment of my debts aforesaid all and singular my personal
 Estate household goods & furniture during her natural life, and to my
 son Jacob Pullman I do give devise and bequeath all that part of
 the old tract of land on Daniels run of black water Surveyed for
 Daniel Donahoo march 19th 1747 which lieth above a new dividing line
 running from two chestnut oaks on a road s^o 35^o West King said run to
 a double chestnut tree on the s^o side of s^o run also part of a tract of one
 hundred and sixty acres on the Branches of s^o run running by a new line
 from the chestnut tree afores^d s^o 28 N 42^o p^o to a Spanish oak s^o 11 W 57^o
 p^o to a white oak in the old line & with it N 14 W 56^o p^o to a horse wood
 m^o 23 E 102^o p^o to a poplar on Daniels run in s^o Donahoo's line and
 with it to the dividing line afores^d also part of 204 acres adjoining s^o
 Donahoo's s^o line's Beginning at Donahoo's Corner Beech on s^o run thence
 S 16^o W 64^o p^o to a white oak thence new line through the tract
 s^o 64 E 28^o to a W O s^o 89 E 50^o to a beech N 14 E to a poplar in the old
 line and with it to the beginning also part of a tract of land of 1670^o
 on the Waters of Black water and Pigeon river running by a dividing line
 along the dividing ridge between s^o Rivers lying to my s^o son Jacob
 Pullman &c all that part of said tract which lieth on the Waters of
 Pigeon river to have and to hold unto my son Jacob &c his heirs &c
