In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Sullivan Sen. of Franklin County and State of Virginia being far advanced in years and knowing it is allotted for all men to die, and being at this time in my proper mind and memory do make this my last Will & Testament, hereby call this my final Will. First I recommend my Soul to God, and my Body to the Burial in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Representatives hereafter named. Second my Will is that my just debts be paid as soon as is Law with the exertion of my Executors; Thirdly I do give unto my Wife Jane all my remaining Estate during her natural life, and at the death of my Wife Jane I Will that all my Estate of every kind should be equally divided between my Children except Johnsons Law's Wife, she has received her full bounty of my Estate in days past and therefore I do leave her but one Dollar of my s^d Estate; I want my Daughter Mary to have her bed, and two hours clear above board out of my Estate &c. I want it to be divided by fair and disinterested men appointed by the Court of Franklin. Lastly I do appoint my Wife Jane Sullivan and my son William Sullivan Executors to this my last Will and Testament, whereof I Samuel Sullivan Sen. hath herunto set my hand and Seal this 28th day of April 1817 signed sealed and Acknowledged

And on the motion of the said Executors who took the Oath prescribed by Law, and together with Leroy Brizendine and Mary Sullivan their Securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of twelve hundred Dollars conditioned according to Law. Certificate is granted them for obtaining a Probate as in form.
