Samuel
Underwood
Examined

In the name of God, amen, I Samuel Underwood being weak
in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be
Almighty God for the same, do make this my last Will
and Testament in the manner and form following that is
to say, first I give unto my beloved wife Misriah
Underwood, all my Land where I now live during her life, &
after her death I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son
Jesse Underwood Eighty acres of my Land where the house is
I do also give unto my eldest Son Samuel Underwood, the
sum of five shillings; and also I give unto my son
Joseph Underwood the sum of five shillings; I also give
unto my son John Underwood, the sum of five shillings;
I also give unto my son Seth Underwood the sum of five
shillings; I also give unto my eldest daughter Hanner
Kerr, the sum of five shillings; I also give unto my
daughter Mary West, the sum of five shillings. At the
decease of my beloved wife Misriah Underwood, I give &
bequeath the balance of my Land to be equally divided
between my two beloved sons Emanuel Underwood and
William Underwood; I also give unto my Daughter
Isley Underwood the sum of five shillings; I also give
unto my beloved wife all my household Furniture & Stock
that is now in my possession unto her during her life, and
at her death, then my Executor is to take all my
household furniture and Stock unto their possession for the
benefit of my five youngest daughters, Elizabeth, Elender,
Sarah, Mary, and Hannah Underwood; I do also appoint
my worthy friend Thos. Goodson, — Misriah Underwood my
Executor. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this 25th day of April 1803.
