is appointed for all men Once to die do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend
my Soul into the hands of the Almighty God that gives it and my Body I recom-
mend to the Earth to be Buried in Christian Burial at the discretion of
my Executors, nothing but at the former Resurrection I shall
the same again by the mighty power of God and be glorified with

yearlings and their increase, and I Give and bequeath unto my dearly
beloved Wife Mary Underwood all of the rest of my property that I
possess now and my Land I Give and bequeath unto my dear
beloved Wife Mary Underwood in possession her life time in
full possession and at her Disceas the Land and Tenements
all that my dear beloved Wife possessis is to be sold and all
my heirs is to have ther Equal part of the money, when I
likewise constitute make and Ordain the sole executrip of
this my last Will and Testament, all and singular my
Lands, mesuages and Tenements, by her freely to be possessed
and enjoyed and I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disan-
null all and every other former Testament, Wills, legacies
bequests and exccutors by me in anywise before named Wills
and bequeathed, Ratifying and confirming this and no other
to be my last Will and Testament in writrip whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and seal this first day of January in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, signed sealed

In the name of God Amen, I Samuel Sullivan Sen. of Franklin County and State of Virginia being far advanced in years and knowing it is allotted for all men to die, and being at this time in my proper mind and memory do make this my last Will & Testament, hereby call this my final Will. First I recommend my soul to God, and my Body to the Buried in a Christian manner at the discretion of my Representatives hereafter named. Second my Will is that my just debts be paid as soon as is Law with the exertion of my Executors; Thirdly I do give unto my Wife Jane all my remaining Estate during her natural life, and at the death of my Wife Jane I Will that all my Estate of every kind should be equally divided between my Children except Johnsons Law's Wife, she has received her full bounty of my Estate in days past and therefore I do leave her but one Dollar of my s^d Estate; I want my Daughter Mary to have her bed, and two hours clear above board out of my Estate &c. I want it to be divided by fair and disinterested men appointed by the Court of Franklin. Lastly I do appoint my Wife Jane Sullivan and my son William Sullivan Executors to this my last Will and Testament, whereof I Samuel Sullivan Sen. hath herunto set my hand and Seal this 28th day of April 1817 signed sealed and Acknowledged

This last Will and Testament of Samuel Sullivan was produced in Court by Jane Sullivan and William Sullivan the Executors hereunto named and proved by the Oaths of Isaac Dehaven and William Brizendine two of the Witnesses hereto and ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion of the said Executors who took the Oath prescribed by Law, and together with Leroy Brizendine and Mary Sullivan their Securities entered into and acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of twelve hundred Dollars conditioned according to Law.
