In the name of God amen I stand hope Richardson of the County of
 Franklin and State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind
 and disposing memory for which I thank God, and calling to mind
 the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all
 such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I do
 hereby make this my last Will and Testament, in manner and form
 as follows (W^{it} Ist I desire that my Executors hereafter mentioned
 shall after my decease, as soon as the nature of the business will
 admit of, make a deed of conveyance in fee simple to that part of
 my Land that Samuel King now lives on which is already
 laid off to him of one hundred twenty six acres to Samuel King.
 the other part of my Land it is my desire that my Executors
 shall proceed to sell or lease at their Discretion either at private
 sale or public auction as they may think most expedient for the
 purpose of paying a certain Sum of money which I am owing
 John Fishburn. If it cannot be discharged any other way but
 by the sale of a Debt of Trust which I have given the said Fishburn,
 which he agrees to wait till next July, and if no probability
 against that time, my Executors must use their discretion in
 the aforesaid business, and after the payments of my Just funeral
 expences, I Give to my well beloved Wife Fanny Richardson

the whole of my Estate both real or personal, during her natural life, and at her decease of what remains in her hands at that time, I desire may be equally divided amongst my several children, hereafter named. It is my will that my son David Richardson shall have one fifth part of what shall be remaining in the hands of my wife Fanny Richardson at her decease of the proceeds of my lands, and is to have no other part of my Estate, more than I have already given him, also I give to my son Brice Richardson one fifth part of the whole of my Estate, which may remain at the time of my wife's decease provided that he shall pay to my Estate One hundred pounds if he fails to pay that sum of money. It is my will, that he shall have but one Dollar, also I give to my daughter Mary King One hundred and twenty six acres of land that she now lives on which I have already directed my Executors to make a right to, and to have no other part of my Estate than I have already given to her also I give to my daughter Ann Maria Richardson one fifth part of all my Estate that shall remain in the hands of my wife ^{after her decease} also I give to my daughter Obecience Daughten one fifth part of my Estate as aforesaid to Decend to her Sister, Nancy Richardson if she shall be longest lived if not to decend to her Brothers and Sisters Equally, provided that the said Obecience Daughten shall have no heir of her body, but if she has to have the whole I also give to my daughter, Nancy Richardson one fifth of all what remains as aforesaid, and Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my Wife Fanny Richardson Executrix & Henry Woody, Senr. Edward Elcoat & Robert Woods, Executors of this my last Will & Testament, Revoking all other former Wills by me made. As Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this 1st day of December 1804

In the name of God, amen, I Elizabeth Ferguson of the County of Franklin, being weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make this my Last Will and Testament, in the first place I ordain that all my Just debts, and funeral expences, after my decease shall be punctually and honestly paid out of my property, Secondly, I will and bequeath to my Daughter Fanny Wade my negro Slave Joshua, Also I give and bequeath to my Grand son Robert Wade, my negro Slave Isaac, to him and his heirs forever, and all other property of every Description, of which I shall die possessed, and all debts which are now or shall then be owing to me, I give and bequeath to my said Daughter Fanny Wade, which together with the aforesaid Slave Joshua, my said Daughter Fanny Wade is to have the sole use and Enjoyment of during her life, and at her death the said property and Slave is to be equally divided among her Children, I hereby appoint Lewis Davis, and my Grand son Robert Wade Executors of this my Last Will & Testament, Given under my hand and Seal this 15 day of November 1806
