I Susanna Meador of Franklin County do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say I give to my sons James Meador and Joseph Meador that is say Toly, Stephen, Jan and her two children, Hy and John to be divided between them as they may think proper, and in consideration of this Legacy they are to give to each of those Sisters that is to say fifty Dollars each, Francis Simmons, Amey Simmons, Susanna Martin, Rhoda Blankenship, Milly Klaborn to be paid each of them as soon there circumstances will admit and one dollar to the Heirs of Jesse Meador and one dollar the Heirs of John Meador, Jonas Meador Abel Meador Isham Meador and Job Meador one dollar, also one dollar to the Heirs of Mary Mard, to each of them there Heirs or assigns and the balance of my property to be equally divided, between James Meador, Joseph Meador and Francis Simmons, to each of them there Heirs Executors, Administrators or assigns for ever, I do hereby constitute and appoint my two sons James Meador and Joseph Meador Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other former Wills or Testament by me heretofore made, In witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of January 1818.
