of Franklin being in perfect Senes Health and memory do ordain this to
be my Last will and Testament in manner and form following, ^{viz} For the first
place my will and Desire is that all my Just debts shall be paid next
I leave unto my Beloved wife a negroe fellow named Simon and his wife ^{only} ~~named~~
and three two children named Easter and James During his natural Life also
I leave unto my wife two feather beds and furniture four cows and Calves Two
Horses and one third part of the rest of my household furniture;
Next I give unto Jacob William Webb Fitzgerald two tracts of Land the
one lying on the north fork of Black Water purchased of James Callaway and
conveyed to me by John Callaway containing Two hundred and sixty nine the other
tract lying on a Branch of Black Water, and purchased of Jeph Ruffin containing
about three hundred and twenty acres to him and heirs forever Next I
give unto Theodorick Fitzgerald two tracts of Land ~~of Land~~ lying on Black Water
the one tract purchased of Mark Ruffin wherein I now live containing
two hundred acres ~~the other containing~~ ~~two hundred acres~~ the other tract purchased of
John Hinton, being two hundred acres more to him and his heirs forever
Lastly my will and desire is that at my decease the whole of my Negroes and other
Estate of mine shall be equally Divided between the above named Jacob William
Webb Fitzgerald ^{and} ~~and~~ ^{and} ~~and~~ Theodorick Fitzgerald
and at the death of my wife their mother my Desire is that they
shall Divide Equally of what I have above left here.

Lastly I nominate, and appoint Jacob William Webb Fitzgerald and Theodorick
Fitzgerald of my Last Will and Testament utterly Disannulling & Repealing all
former wills and Testaments made by me in Witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand affixed my seal this 10 day of October one Thousand seven hundred

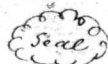

Whereas I have given Ann Estes & Joel Estes her husband the Just right and title to the said Negro James with the hies which I think five pounds a year is little enough for every year since the first year. In the name of God amen. Theodorick Webb of Franklin County State of Virginia being very infirm in body - but of perfect memory & disposing memory, do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner herein following to wit - my soul I humbly offer to Almighty God who gave it; and my body I wish to be decently buried at the discretion of my beloved Wife Sarah Webb who I hereby constitute & appoint my sole & only Executrix. And as to my Worldly Estate with which it has pleased God to bless me, It is my Will and desire that the same both real and personal be kept together & carried on in the same manner that it is now carried on by me, until my youngest Child arrives to the age of twenty one years old; and that the profits arising from the same over & above what shall be found necessary for the decent and genteel support of my family without Extravagance, be carefully placed out at interest, and it is my Will and desire that my ^{beloved} Wife Sarah Webb have the direction & management of my Estate to be carried on

as above directed during her life or widowhood, but in the event she shall marry, then it is my Will and desire that she have allotted to her by my Executors hereinafter named one equal third part of my Estate both real & personal during her natural life; and at her death to be subject to the distributions herein after directed. If she shall die after being married before my youngest child arrives to the age of twenty one years, then the allotment of property herein directed to be made to her is to return to the ^{general} ~~original~~ Stock and be subject to the distributions herein after directed when my youngest child comes to the age of twenty one years; It is my Will & desire that when my oldest Daughter Nancy Webb shall marry, or shall arrive at the age of twenty one years old, that she receive one Negro Girl named Sally with her increase, one feather Bed Furniture, & also one thousand Dollars, to be paid out of the moneys arising from the profits of my Estate - Also it is my Will & desire that when my second Daughter Jane Webb shall marry, or shall arrive to the age of twenty one years old - that she receive one Negro Girl named Jenny with her increase, one feather Bed Furniture, And also one thousand Dollars to be paid in like manner out of the profits of my Estate - Also it is my Will & desire, that when my youngest Daughter Ursula Webb shall marry, or shall arrive to the age of twenty one years - that she also receive one Negro Girl named Charlotte with her increase - one feather Bed Furniture & the sum of one thousand Dollars, to be paid out of the moneys arising from the profits of the Estate, also I will and bequeath to my eldest son Theodorick Webb five Tracts of Land to wit, one Tract purchased of Bartlet Wade, one Tract purchased of Jacob Noffs, & three Tracts on the head Waters of Neen Oak & Little River, to wit, one purchased of John Kelly, two Tracts purchased of John Kridg - Also I give & bequeath unto my second son Greed Webb the Land on which Snow lived, forty acres I got of Samuel Hairston, one hundred & twenty seven acres I got of William Ahers - Two hundred & thirteen acres I got of Joshua Renshaw, the Tract I got of Jacob Kinnis, with my grist mill, and also the Land I exchanged for with William Ahers - Also I give and bequeath to my youngest son Bird Webb

Two Tracts of Land, one Tract I purchased of William Anderson on Black Water called the Heitken Tract, and one Tract purchased of John Kelly containing Two hundred Acres & adjoining the Tract I purchased of Bartlett Wade, all of which several Tracts of Land, as above will to my said three sons, it is my Will & desire that they receive possession, as they respectively arrive to the ages of Twenty one years old and in the event that either of my said Sons die without issue, It is my Will and desire that the Lands herein given to them, shall be equally divided among the surviving Brothers or Brothers, and it is also my Will & desire, that my negroes together with the residue of my personal Estate be divided equally among my six children, & in the event that either of my Daughters should die before they marry, then it is my Will I desire that the legacy or portion herein given to them, shall go to the surviving Sisters or Sister. I further Will & bequeath unto each of my said Daughters, one horse & Saddle to be furnished them at the Discretion of my Wife, or Executors, and in the event that either the negro girls given to either of my said daughters, should die, before my said Daughters marry, then it is my Will & desire, that others of equal value be selected from the Estate & be substituted in their place, and finally in the event my loving wife Sarah Webb should die, or marry before my children respectively arrive to the age of twenty one years old, then it is my Will & desire, I do hereby direct that my Estate, both real & personal be kept together, & be carried on in manner & form as before directed under the management & directions of my Brother Jacob Webb & Henry Halloway, who I hereby nominate & appoint as my Executors & Guardians to my children. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal this second day of May in the year of our Lord Christ Eighteen hundred & Eleven

In the name of God amen. I Happy Tally of the County of Franklin &
 State of Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind & disposing memory
 for which I thank God, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human
 life and being desirous to dispose of all such Worldly Estate as it
 hath pleased God to bless me with, do make this my Last will and
 Testament. In the first place I ordain after my decease that all
 my Last Debts and funeral expences shall be punctually & honestly
 paid out of property. Secondly I will and bequeath to my son Pleasant
 Tally my Negro Slave King one bed & furniture one near bed
 and saddle. Also one hundred acres of Land it being the Land and
 plantation that I now live on. Also I give and bequeath to my
 Daughter Nancy Richardson Tally my Negro Slave Caty one
 Bed and furniture, one bow and arrow, to live their heirs forever. Also
 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Richardson one Dollar
 and no more of my Estate. Also I give to my Daughter Pally Green
 one Dollar & no more of my Estate. Also I give and bequeath to
 my Daughter Susanah Tally one Dollar and no more of my
 Estate. Also I desire that all my household & Kitchen not
 bequeath and my Stock of Hogs shall be sold after my decease
 and the money arising therefrom with all my Debts after collected
 shall be equally divided between my son Pleasant Tally and
 my Daughter Nancy Richardson Tally, and every other property
 both Real or personal that I shall die possessor of shall be equally
 divided between the said Pleasant & Nancy Tally by my Executor
 I also appoint and ordain Lewis Davis Executor of this my
 Last Will and Testament. Given under my hand and
