In the name of God amen, I Thomas Payne of Franklin County State of Virginia being weak and low in body, but in perfect mind disposing mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows, to wit, first my desire is that my son Joseph Payne shall have that part of my Land wherein he now lives beginning where my line crosses a branch on the East side of my tract of Land thence up said branch as it meanders to a poplar on the branch thence to a Gum at the lower end of a pond thence to said Josephs fence where it makes a sudden turn up a branch, thence with his fence untill it strikes my fence, thence running with my fence to where it makes a turn, thence a straight line to a poplar near a branch, thence a North East course untill it strikes my line, to him the said Joseph & his heirs for ever. secondly, I give to my son Sibaam Payne my Mountain plantation Beginning at a poplar corner to Joshs Paynes lot thence running a straight line to a double poplar in the gap of the mountain, thence a North course to my corner thence, to him & his heirs for ever.

Thirdly, I give to my son Thomas Payne all that part of my land lying on the North side of Synoville mountain to him & his heirs for ever. Fourthly I give to my son Robert Payne a certain lot and part of land on the south side of my tract of land beginning at the fork of a branch on the road leading to Jacob Markriders thence up the south fork of the branch to Milner Paynes fence, thence a straight line to my corner on the side of Synoville Mountain at a place called the yellow Banks, to him this heirs for ever. Fifthly I give to Milner Payne widow of my son George Payne Decd. a certain lot and part of my land, beginning at the fork of the branch, to Jacob Markriders thence up the North fork of said branch to the head of an old field thence up a ridge to where my line crosses a branch to her and her heirs for ever. Sixthly I give to my two sons Reed Payne and Mark Payne all the balance of my land to be hereafter divided between them as may suit the parties, to them & their heirs for ever. Seventhly I give to my two grand sons Green Richardson & Thomas Richardson a fifty dollar bond each to be paid in two years after the Dec^d of me & my wife. Eighthly I give to my Daughter Nancy Richardson forty pounds to be paid within two years after the Dec^d of me & my wife. Ninthly my desire is that my wife Margaret shall have all my living stock & household furniture of every kind together with the house I now live in during her life, and after her Dec^d to equally divided between my three sons Abraham, Reed & Mark Payne. Tenthly and lastly I do appoint my sons Joseph Payne, Reed Payne & Mark Payne, my Executors to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 16th day of April 1815.

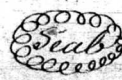

At a Court held for Franklin County June 5th 1815

This last Will and Testament of Thomas Payne

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 deceased, was proved by the solemn affirmation of Sarah Hanson and
 Thomas Wright, two of the witnesses hereto, and ordered to be recorded
 and at assizes held for said County September 4th 1865. On the motion
 of Joseph Payne and Reid Payne two of the Executors in the said Will
 named, who made oath as the Law directs, and together with Elijah
 Brockman and John Bowman their securities entered into and
 acknowledged their Bond in the penalty of five hundred Dollars
 conditioned as the Law directs, Certificate is granted them for
 obtaining a Probate in due form, liberty being reserved to the other
 Executor to join in the Probate when he shall think fit.
