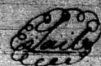

 and State of Virginia being sick and weak in Body but of perfect
 mind and memory Thanks to God for it calling to mind the mortality
 of my body Do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament
 that is to say principally & first of all I give and recommend my
 Soul unto God that gave it and my Body to be decently Buried at
 the Discretion of my Executors and as for such worldly Estate wherewith
 it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give and dispose of the
 same in the following manner and form that in the first place all
 my just Debts and funeral charges be paid and I give unto my
 son Thomas whom I likewise constitute make and ordain my
 only and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament to him
 his heirs and assigns for ever the Land whereon him I now live to
 paying unto his other 2 brothers James and Samuel to Each fifty
 Dollars for their part of said Land and the Rest of my Estate to be
 Equally divided amongst all my Children Viz James and Samuel and
 Thomas and Ann and Mary and Margaret and Rachel and I do
 hereby utterly disallow revoke & Disannul all other Wills testaments
 by me heretofore made Ratifying and confirming this
 only to be and last Will
