In the name of God Amen, I Thomas Jackson of Franklin County being weak in Body but sound mind and perfect memory do constitute this my last Will and Testament and resign my soul to God who gave it, my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken as for my burial I desire it may be decent without pomp or state at the discretion of my dear wife and Executors hereafter mentioned, who I doubt not will manage it with all requisite prudence, as to my worldly Estate, I desire positively that my just debts shall be paid First I leave to my dear wife Milley Jackson all my Estate both Real and personal to her for her Life except a part of the Land lying on the west side of my son William Jacksons spring branch, I leave to my son William Jackson and his heirs as follows to wit, Beginning at the mouth of said branch running up the branch to the crop fence, then a strait line to the back line running with the branch the above described land, I leave to my son William Jackson yet so that he is not impowered to sell or rent but to have peaceable himself for his life time

By I leave the Balance of the Land to be divided between my two Daughters Polly Mitchel and Milley Jackson

267 as equal as can be devised by two disinterested men and after the death of my son William, the Land I leave to him for his life to be devised in the same way, and my youngest daughter, Milley is to have her first choice in both places after the land is valued by the two disinterested men. 4th by my Daughter Milley Jackson is to have first choice now, likewise first choice Bed and furniture and one leather bound Trunk, and one folding table, I leave to her for ever. 5th by the balance of my Estate I leave to be equally divided between the before named, Polly Mitchel and Milley Jackson after the death of my wife, and I do hereby appoint Alexander Gray, Winston Holland, James Anderson and Maccager Turner Executors to this my last Will and Testament, as Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal this third day of March 1819.
